She started power lifting in 2006 and won a Bronze medal at the London 2012 paralympic games. In a special assembly Zoe answered all our questions, told us how hard she had to train for the competition, what she was allowed to eat and what she couldn't eat. (No fast food which she loves!) She then visited all the classes and let the children look at her medal and pass it around.
