### Sweet Pretzels... Mmmm

Responding to popular demand we are printing Manuela's sweet pretzel recipe (that was such a hit during our International Day of Languages...)

400g Plain Flour  
200 g Quark (from the cheese section)  
100 g Sugar  
8 Tablespoons of Oil  
8 Teaspoons of Baking Powder

Preheat your oven to 190C. Mix all the ingredients together to make a dough. If necessary add a little bit of water (2-3 tablespoons). Roll and shape the Pretzels. Cover baking tray with baking paper and place pretzels on tray. Bake for around 20 min. Take out of the oven and enjoy!
