Alice meets the brothers together and they make this statement:


1st one: I am Tweedle Dee

Did you know that the earliest ice skating happened in Finland more than 3000 years ago? Then, skates were simply sharpened, flattened bone strapped to the the foot and skaters glided over the ice. Skating as we know it today began in Holland in the 13th or 14th century, when skates with a steel blade and sharpened edges were developed. Skates now cut into the ice instead of gliding on top of it.
