Did you know that UNICEF was created on December 11, 1946? It was originally set up to provide emergency food and healthcare to children in countries devastated by World War II. In 1954 its name was shortened from the original (United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund) to the acronym it has now. It is based in New York City and provides humanitarian aid to children and mothers in developing countries. It is present in 191 countries around the world.
