Benjamin read out the names of 30 soldiers and Y6 planted a cross for each soldier. Benjamin and Katie are pictured (on Page 1) at the foot of the war memorial Memorial as they looked for the names they had read out.

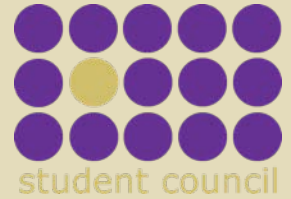


*Mariella Mystery Investigates the Huge Hair Scare* by Kate Pankhurst
