

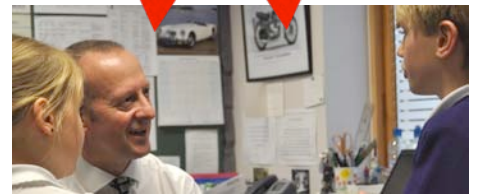

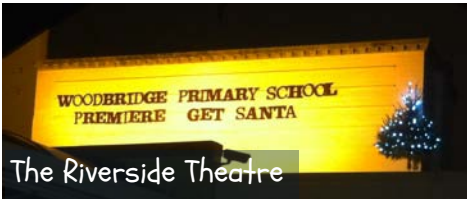

Christmas Cracker Dinner

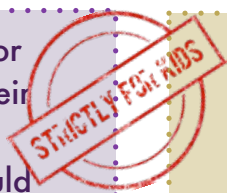

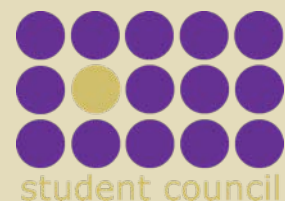
