

Did you know that William Shakespeare's *The Tempest* is believed to have been written in 1610–11, and thought to be the last play that Shakespeare wrote alone? The story draws on traditions of the romance and tragicomedy and was perhaps influenced by commedia dell'arte. **Commedia dell'arte** is a form of theatre which began in Italy in the 16th century was improvised performances based on sketches or scenarios. The closest translation of the name is "comedy of craft".
