**Oliver** for always working to the best of his ability in all areas across the curriculum.




**Imogen** for her exceptionally well organised guide to looking a 'Dragacy' creature.



# KIDS circle


The Kids Circle is for students to have their say! If there is something you would like included here speak to Ms Evans in the office. 😊
